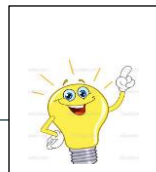

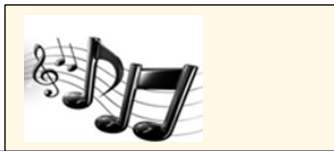

Course Title: *Music Through the Ages - From the Siddur*

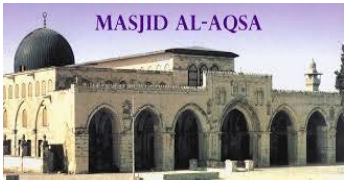

Course Title: *Jerusalem Contested: Readings, Analysis and Discussion*

Course Sponsor: Institute for Jewish Learning of the Jewish Theological Seminary

Course Description: Jerusalem is considered a holy city to three faiths: Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. In this Context Seminar, we will learn the history of Jerusalem, from its founding in pre-biblical times, until the present. Using a wide range of sources, including biblical lamentations, archeological excavations, qur'anic passages, medieval pilgrim itineraries, modern poetry, and political negotiating handbooks, Dr. Gribetz will reconstruct Jerusalem's past, and help us to understand it from the perspectives of Jews, Christians, and Muslims.

Course Title: *The Bible Through Literary Eyes*

Course Description: This course will focus on the literary artistry of the Bible by examining the manner in which language and literature intersect to create the prose and poetry of the Bible, and how recent translations of the Bible reflect this linkage. We will learn how people in ancient Israel heard and read this literature, and survey the literary-linguistic devices the Bible uses. We will study the narratives on the creation of the world, Abraham, Jacob and Joseph, as well as sections of the legal and cultic material, the stories of Deborah and Yael, and David and Bathsheba.

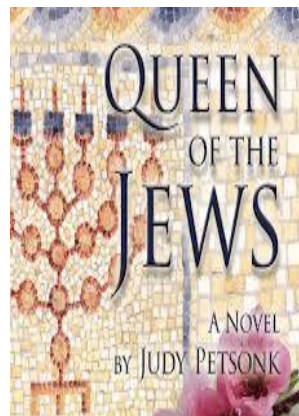
